She was Chair of the ACR's Commission on Economics and the radiology member of the AMA's Relative Value Update Committee from 2012-2016.

In May 2016 she was elected as the Vice Chair of the ACR's Board of Chancellors, the first woman to hold this office. She was until 2013, Managing Partner of a 70 physician multispecialty medical group on Long Island, and joined Weill Cornell Medicine in 2014.
