Professor Rajesh graduated from Madras Medical College, Chennai, India, and completed his Radiology training at University Hospitals of Leicester. This was followed by a Fellowship in Abdominal Imaging at Indiana University School of Medicine in 2003, before taking up a consultant position at University Hospitals of Leicester. He specialises in Hepatobiliary Imaging, inflammatory bowel disease and Urologic Imaging.

Professor Rajesh was a member of the FRCR Physics Working group from 2008–2012 and Chair of the group in 2012. He has held numerous editorial roles with Radiology journals including Clinical Radiology and was awarded the prestigious Lee F Rogers International Fellowship in Radiology Journalism by the American Roentgen Ray Society in 2010. He is also involved with international trials, has published extensively, is the author of two textbooks on Crohn's Disease and GU Imaging and an invited speaker at many international meetings.

Professor Rajesh is a keen educator and has worked with colleagues in the East Midlands to establish the Radiology Academy in 2019 and continues to promote newer and novel methods of education in Radiology nationally.
